Getting Really Close to God Psalm 15

(Page 538 or 542)

Big Idea: God can be as close to us as a dear friend!

James 4:8 "Come near to God and he will come near to you."

This Psalm begins with a wonderful question: Verse 1 "LORD, who may dwell in your sanctuary? Who may live on your holy hill?" In other words, what are the

characteristics of God's good friends? This psalm declares the **terms of friendship** between man and Jehovah. --G. Campbell Morgan in Exposition on the Whole Bible blameless and who does what is righteous...' Blameless [NAS, walks with integrity]. 1. An unimpaired condition. 2. Adherence to a code of moral, artistic, or other values. 3. The quality or state of being complete or undivided. The Apostle Paul: I am conscious of nothing against myself. 1 Corinthians 4:4 We break rules—we violate God's will—because we think breaking them will help us win, or at least avoid pain....In a strict sense, I cannot break the rules. They endure, for they reflect the way things are. I can only break myself against them. -- John Ortberg in When the Game Is Over 2. heart ³ and has no slander on his tongue, who does his neighbor no wrong and casts no slur on his fellow man." Matthew 12:34-35 "For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks. 35 The good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and the evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him." The absent one must be safe among us.--Amy Carmichael DISCRIMINATING -Verse 4a "...who 3. despises a vile man but honors those who fear the LORD..." Compromise never works. We always get burned. Even though we rationalize around our weak decisions and tell ourselves that wicked associations really won't harm us ("they'll get better, our good will rub off their bad!"), we get soiled in the process. If you put on a pair of clean white gloves on a rainy day and then go out into the backyard to the flowerbed and pick up a glob of mud, trust me, the

mud will never get "glovey."

The gloves will definitely get muddy. Every time.

In all my sixty-plus years on earth, I have never seen glovey mud. Not once.

In simple terms, that's what 1 Corinthians 15:33 is saying: "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company corrupts good morals."'--Charles Swindoll in Wisdom for the Way

- **5. INCORRUPTIBLE**—Verse **5** "...who lends his money without usury and does not accept a bribe against the innocent..."
 - The Hebrew word for interest is derived from another word meaning "to bite."-- John Calvin
 - Money at interest (5a) is condemned in the Bible, not in general (cf. Deuteronomy 23:20; Matthew 25:27) but in the context of trading on a brother's misfortunes, as a comparison between Deuteronomy 23:19 and Leviticus 25:35-38 makes clear. The latter passage equally forbids selling him food at a profit. In the family, one carried the weaker member; outside it the law allowed discretion, while forbidding extortion and encouraging generosity (cf. Exodus 23:9; Leviticus 19:33f.). In this psalm, no distinction is hinted at between a brother and a stranger in need.--Derek Kidner
- P.S. Aside from the blessing of being close to God a life of these qualities is a life of ultimate security. **Verse 5a**, "*He who does these things will never be shaken.*"
