## Message Questions

We're in a year-long journey through the books of 1 and 2 Samuel, tracing the rise, reign, and legacy of Israel's most famous king. We'll see the story of how God works through real people with real flaws to accomplish his purposes. This week we are in **1 Samuel 20**, and the big idea is: We all need faithful and godly friendships.

Use these questions to discuss the message from Sunday, focusing on how you can **grow** as an everyday follower of Jesus and how you can **go** accomplish what Jesus calls you to do.

1. Have someone read **1 Samuel 20:1-4**. In this passage, David is honest about his fear and confusion. How does Jonathan's response in **vs. 4** demonstrate the difference between a casual acquaintance and a godly friend, and why is this level of commitment so vital in a culture where 50% of people feel a lack of companionship?
2. Have someone read **1 Samuel 20:30-33** and **John 15:13**. The sermon mentions that real friendship requires personal risk. What exactly was Jonathan risking by standing up to Saul, and how does his willingness to face the "spear" for David help us better understand the kind of sacrificial love Jesus talks about in John?

3. Have someone read **1 Samuel 20:8-10** and **Proverbs 27:6**. David asks Jonathan for honesty, even if it's painful. Why is the ability to "say the hard thing" or offer "trustworthy wounds" essential for a friendship to reveal the truth rather than just provide comfort?
