MISSIONARY UPDATE

DANIEL & BETH TAGGART

FLAGSTAFF MISSION TO THE NAVAJOS



Abe & Elaine White met with the Taggarts on Zoom recently...read their report below!

Dan & Beth minister to the people of the Navajo Nation, the largest reservation in the U.S. The Navajo religion is animistic in nature; people tend to

be superstitious, live in fear, and strive to appease the spirits to try and regain harmony with the gods. Much of the Navajo Nation is in third world conditions; many are without running water and electricity.

Dan's parents came to minister to the Navajo people in the early 1960's, so he and his sister grew up on the reservation; most of his friends were Navajo. Dan went to Christian boarding school in Oklahoma for 9th grade. After his freshman year in high school, Dan's dad was tragically killed as a result of a head-on collision by someone who had been drinking at a ceremonial night. Instead of bitterness, The Lord gave Dan a love and a burden for the Navajo people and to help them. Every summer he returned home to help his mom work with the church through the years. He went on to attend Tennessee Temple University and received a degree in business with minor in Bible, and came back to work with the mission. Dan grew up in and is accepted in the community...he's pretty much Navajo on the inside and white on the outside.

Dan's vision is to take Christ to the people who still live in darkness, living in traditional ways...using, eating, and drinking peyote, a hallucinogenic drug, during ceremonies and have visions. They say peyote is a way to god; they worship peyote instead of God. Dan's prayer is that they may come to know Christ, have hope and joy, and live in victory without fear.

Beth attended ACC and went on several mission trips to Turkey, Greece, and Mexico, which God used to direct her life and led her to serving with Dan to the Navajo people. Dan and Beth met online. Beth's transition wasn't easy when she first joined Dan on the mission, but has grown to love the youth.
