Dear Alderwood family, In April, Dave got the opportunity to go with Pastor Steve and Pastor Gordon Everett of Snohomish Community Church to visit some of the more rural places where *Vidilaka (pseudonym) people live. The places around them have been hit by instability

and therefore resources haven't been easily available. Thanks to generous partners, we were able to get a well drilled there as a step toward sustainable water for the community. We have been praying for awhile for an opportunity to visit these folks in their home areas and help them be seen in their different hardships. While there, Dave was able to see the excitement people had over the books of the Bible that have been distributed like Galatians and Colossians. God also showed us the work that He has been doing among their community through the local church. We have been praying for years for people to start literacy programs and to see the importance of literacy in their own community. As Dave was being shown around there they were under trees, sitting together listening intently, school children being taught how to read and write their own language. This is monumental! Not only does this show the type of community initiative that we have been praying for, but it also provides these children with the opportunity to engage written Scripture. It shows some change in people's hearts to start something even if no one is paying them because their community and their children are worth it. This is also happening in the capital city. Praise God for bringing people who are willing to teach and encourage literacy.

One of the harder things to see was the extreme poverty of the area and its people. We work with refugees in a neighboring country and interact with their poverty often. We hear the reports of the suffering happening in their home country, but seeing it first hand is hard to process. Please pray for God to continue to work in their hearts. Pray that God will provide for their physical needs and that Scripture will become rooted in their communities. Thank you for your partnership!
