

JESUS FEEDS 5000


Spot 8 differences between the two pictures.

DOWNTOWN ZOO QUESTIONS

After watching our video and reading the provided Bible passage go through these questions as a family. These are great questions to discuss as a family. Don't just have your child answer, answer them together and discuss the lesson.

- 1. Who shared a lunch? What was it?
- 2. What is your favorite thing to eat for lunch?
- 3. Who showed love to a hungry crowd of people? How?
- 4. The Bible says, "God gives us what we need". What are some things that God provides for you? Have you thanked him for those things?
- *Take some time to list out some things God has provided for your family. Then take the time to pray and thank him for those things/people.

UPTOWN KIDS QUESTIONS (LIGHTHOUSE & THRIVE)

- 1. Jesus didn't tell the crowds to go away, instead, He had compassion on them because they were lost. What part of God's character does this show?
- 2. The loaves and fish came from a boy. Do you imagine the boy gave them to Jesus willingly or reluctantly? Describe how we can share with others during this current time.
- 3. Does this part of the Bible remind you of any other parts of the Bible? Can you think of another part of the Bible where God provides for the people or uses bread?
- 4. Right after this miracle in John 6:22-44, Jesus says that he is the "bread that came down from heaven" What does this mean?
- 5. He said that no one who comes to Him will ever be hungry, and no one who believes in Him will ever be thirsty again. How does God provide for our biggest need?
- 6. When Jesus provides for us, He provides abundantly. Share some ways in which God has provided for your family in abundant ways.
- **As you teach kids this Bible story, help them know that God can and will provide for our needs. Kids can trust Him for their "daily bread." (See Matt. 6:11.) God met our greatest need in giving us salvation through Jesus. Will He not graciously give us all things? (Rom. 8:32)
