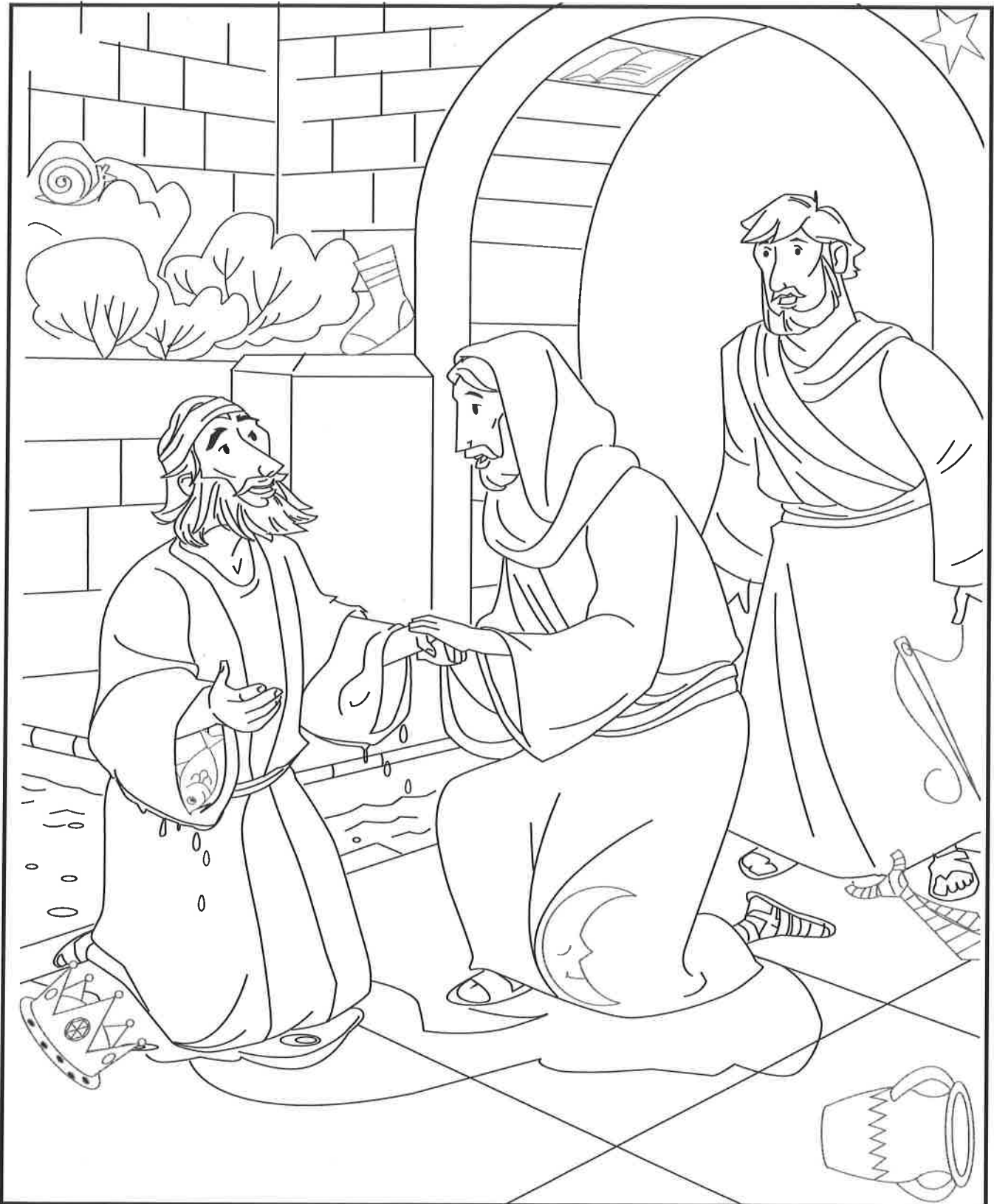

2. What did Jesus use to heal his eyes? What did the man do once he could see again?
3. Has there been a time where Jesus helped you? What can you say to thank Jesus for times when he helps you?
4. What does this story tell us about Jesus and who He is?

1. Why was the man born blind? How did Jesus heal the man?
2. What did the religious leaders do to the healed man?
3. In what ways are we like the man who was born blind? *(Talk about what it means to be born in sin and being spiritually blind)*
4. Why do you think Jesus calls Himself the Light of the world? What are some ways that he "lights up" our life?
5. How can we be given "spiritual sight"? *(Think about the message of the gospel)*
6. How does Jesus cause us to think differently about suffering?

*Jesus gave sight to a man who was blind. In a similar way, Jesus gives us spiritual sight when we trust in Him. God forgives our sins and opens our eyes to see the truth of His Word. The Holy Spirit helps us love and obey God.
