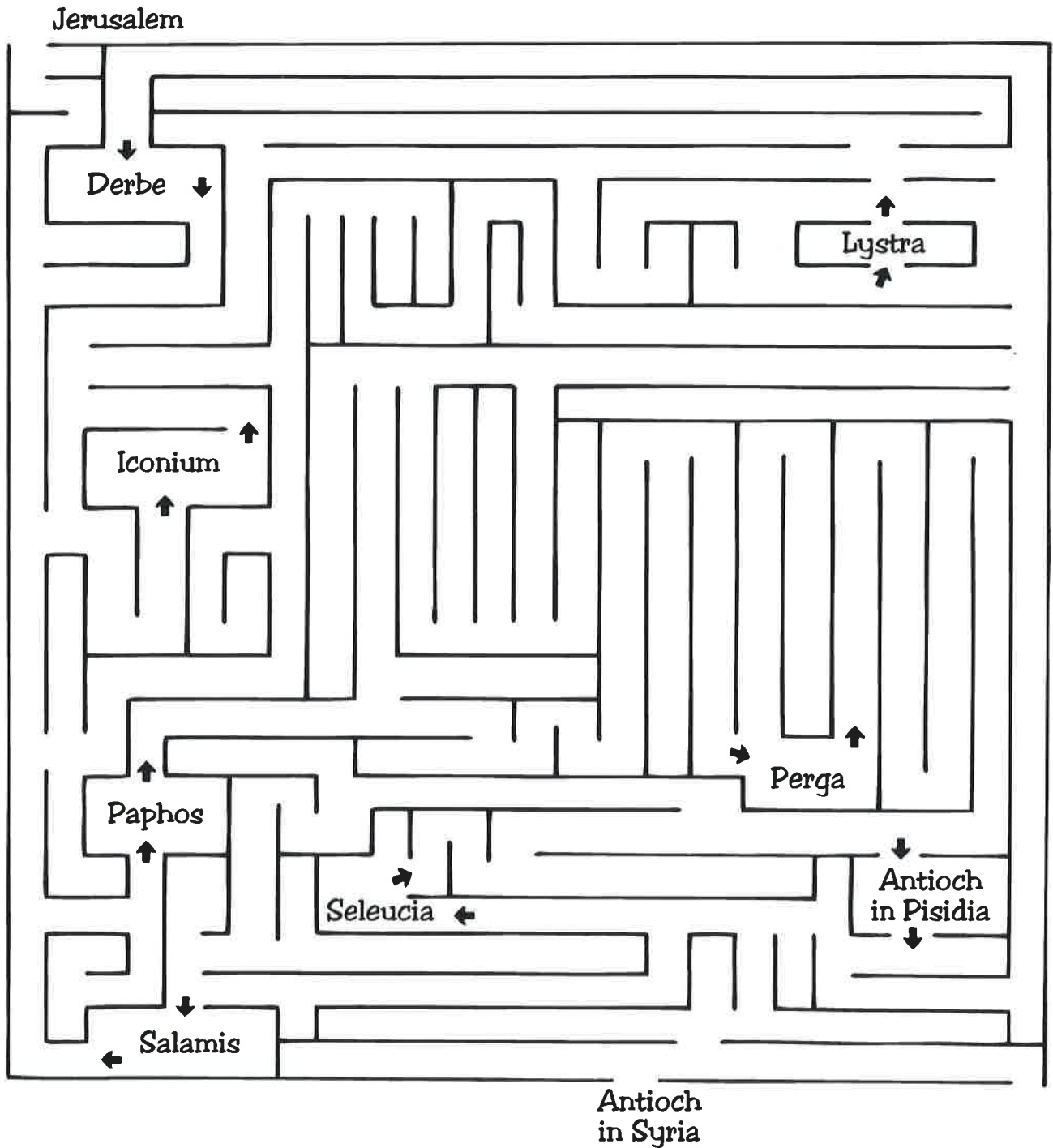
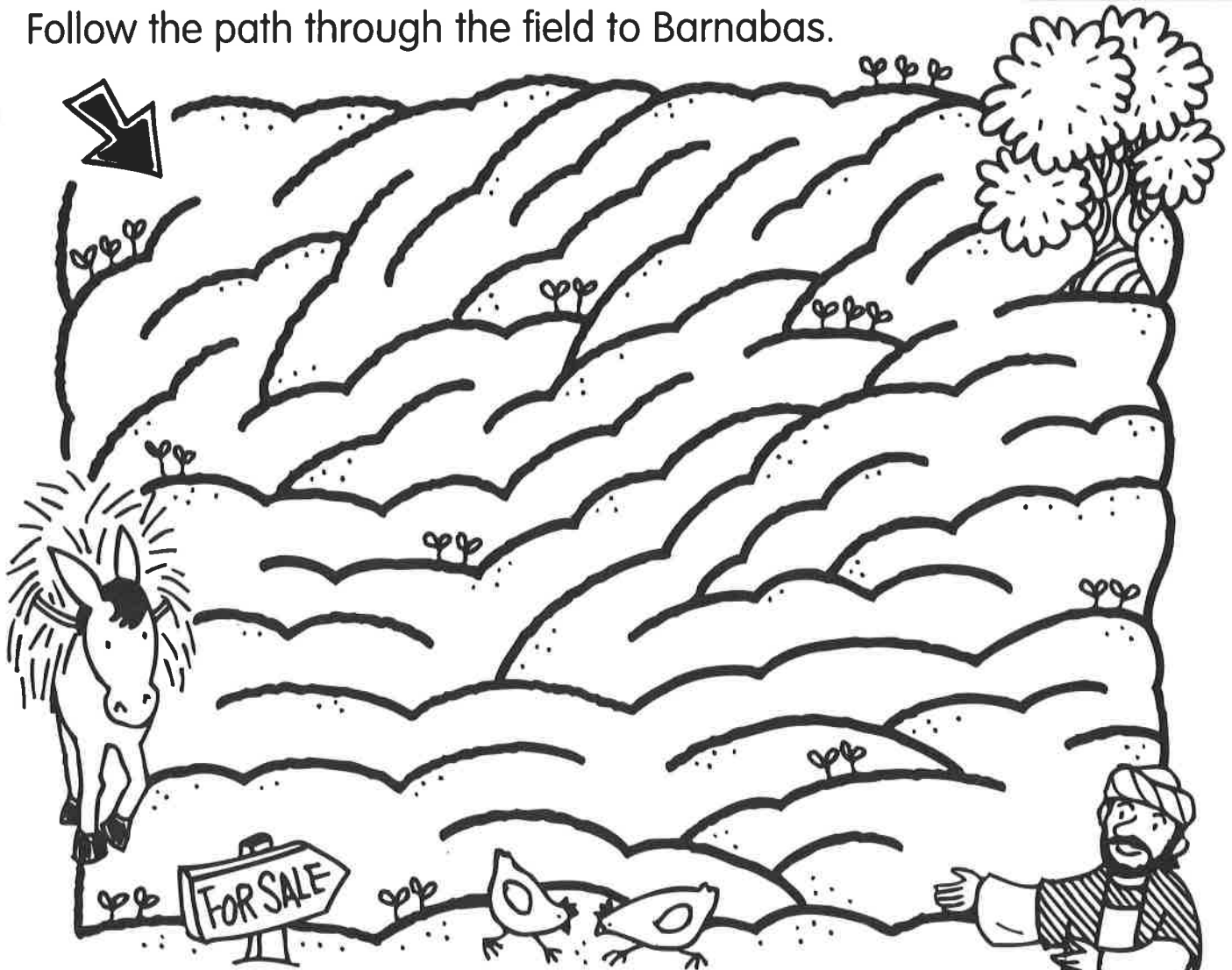


Amazing Paul and Barnabas

Using the information in Acts find each city in the maze in the order that Paul and Barnabas visited them. You may not cross or retrace the path. Have fun following the first missionary journey.

DOWNTOWN ZOO QUESTIONS

After watching our video and reading the provided Bible passage go through these questions as a family. These are great questions to discuss as a family. Don't just have your child answer, answer them together and discuss the lesson.

1. What is a missionary? Do you know anyone personally who considers being a missionary as their “full time job”?
2. Can you be a missionary? Even if you aren't in a far-away country?
3. Why did Paul and Barnabas go on their journey?
4. Who did the people of Lystra think Paul and Barnabas were? How did Paul and Barnabas react?

UPTOWN KIDS QUESTIONS (LIGHTHOUSE & THRIVE)

1. Why did Paul and Barnabas go on the journey? Where did they go?
2. What did they do in Lystra?
3. Who did the people of Lystra think Paul and Barnabas were? How did Paul and Barnabas react when the people wanted to offer sacrifices to them?
4. What did the Jews from Antioch and Iconium do? What did Paul and Barnabas tell the disciples afterwards?
5. Have you ever faced trials when telling someone about Jesus? Is God always with you in those trials? How do you know?
6. What does it mean to be a “missionary”? How is that different from living “on mission”? Is there someone you can tell about Jesus this week?
7. Who are some of the missionaries at our church? What are some ways that you can support them? (Look at alderwood.cc/missions.)

**Paul once persecuted Christians, but Jesus changed him and he became a missionary. How do people hear about Jesus? God uses Christians to tell others about Jesus so they may repent and be saved. The Holy Spirit sent Paul and Barnabas to tell Jews and Gentiles about Jesus. They obeyed God's call. The gospel spread, and the church grew.*
