

JESUS' TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

Matthew 21; Mark 11; Luke 19; John 12

There are many options here, for all age groups. Pick and choose some fun activities that will work best for your family!

Bible & Science

Supplies: uncooked spaghetti, 1 cup of water, 2 teaspoons of baking soda ,5 teaspoons of vinegar, tall clear glass

- 1. Put the water and baking soda in the glass, stir until the baking soda is dissolved.
- 2. Break spaghetti into 1-inch pieces, put about 6 pieces into the glass (They will sink to the bottom)
- 3. Add 5 teaspoons of vinegar to the mixture, observe what happens to the pieces of spaghetti (it should rise to the top, keep adding vinegar until it does)

Question Here: What happened to the spaghetti? Did they rise to the top?

Our praise for Jesus should be like the spaghetti! Rising to the top! We need to let our praises and thanks for all that Jesus has done be shown to the world. In our experiment the spaghetti eventually sank back to the bottom. We don't want our praise and thanks to do that.

A CLOAK PATH - GAME

The goal of this game is for the group to try and move on person on their team from one side of the room to the other. You will need at least three players.

- 1. One person will be Jesus (they are trying to get to Jerusalem (the other side of the room))
- 2. The other two people each have a hand towel. They will lay their towel down in front of Jesus.
- 3. As each towel is walked on, it will be picked up and placed in front of Jesus a little further down the room. Do this until you get to the end.
- *For additional fun you can add obstacles to move around, or time two teams to see who can do it faster. Remember Jesus can only touch the towels.
