## **Life Group Questions**

1.	Read <b>John 13:2-5</b> . Jesus washed the feet of all his disciples – <u>including Judas</u> . Why do you suppose Jesus even washed Judas' feet, all the while knowing he would betray Him?
2.	Read <b>Mark 14:1-2</b> and <b>43</b> . Describe the contrast in attitude and action of the chief priests and scribes toward Jesus.
	Now read <b>Mark 14:34</b> and <b>48-49</b> . Describe the contrast in Jesus' attitude.
	Read <b>Mark 14:31</b> and <b>14:50</b> . Just a few hours pass between these verses. What changed for Peter and the disciples in that brief time?
3.	Put yourself in the moment when Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss. How would you describe the emotion of that moment as Jesus and Judas stood there looking each other in the eyes?
	Describe a time when you felt betrayed by someone close to you. What emotions did you experience?

1.	Read <b>Colossians 3:12-13</b> . How do these verses affect you as you think of someone who has hurt or betrayed you?
	What does it mean to forgive another person? Is there a difference between forgiveness and reconciliation?
	Why do we have difficulty forgiving those who hurt us? Is forgiveness that important?
5.	Jesus forgave those who deserted Him and would have forgiven Judas, had he come to Him. How will <b>Zechariah 4:6</b> , <b>Philippians 4:13</b> , and Pastor Brad's message help you forgive someone who has hurt you in some way?
