1.	Eugene Cho said, "Christianity is not a bystander religion." What does that
	mean to you? Do you agree?

2. If you're not one to constantly, or occasionally, talk to people about Jesus, do you think you'll ever be able to do it? What scares you or keeps you from stepping out and taking that risk?

- 3. Listed below are the six main reasons or barriers that impede Christians from sharing the good news of Jesus. How many of the six do you identify with?
 - The erroneous thought: People think all roads go to the same place, so it doesn't matter if I share the gospel.
 - We've personally forgotten the love of Christ.
 - We struggle with fear of being rejected or stigmatized as "one of those Christians".
 - We focus on the ends of the earth but forget our "Jerusalem".
 - Someone else is going to do it. I can leave it to the "professionals".
 - I haven't experienced success in sharing the gospel, so why do it.

7.	Read Acts 1:8 and 13:47 . How many times to you see the word "you" in these verses? What does that emphasis mean to you?
8.	Read Acts 1:8 again. What is your responsibility in evangelism? What is God's responsibility?
9.	Do you believe that God has strategically placed you in your family, community, and workplace? With God there are no coincidences. Acts 1:8 says the Holy Spirit gives us power to be Christ's witnesses where we are. What do you think would happen if you prayed this prayer each day:
