Sermon questions

Mark 15:20b-41

1. Pastor Brad described how the cross has become the identifying symbol of Christians. Why do you think this is true?

2. Read **Mark 15:20b-41**. In describing the crucifixion, Mark simply states, "They *crucified* Him" (v.**24**). What do you suppose went on in the minds of Mark's initial readers when they read those words? What goes on in your mind as you read them today?

3.	Pastor Brad not only described the physical pain Jesus suffered, but also the spiritual agony. Read Mark 15:34 . Look up the word, "forsaken" in this verse. What goes on in your mind when you consider this aspect of Jesus' suffering for you?
4.	Read 1 Corinthians 1:18 . Do you think unbelievers today see the cross of Christ as "foolishness"? Explain.
	How is the cross the power of God for those who are being saved?
5.	Read Galatians 6:14 . In what do you "boast"? The cross of Christ or something else? Explain.
6.	Pastor Brad described three ways in which we experience the power of the cross. Read Colossians 2:13-15 . Is there a sin in your life that you think is <i>outside</i> the scope of God's forgiveness? How do these verses speak to that kind of thinking?

7.	The cross gives access to God in prayer. Read Hebrews 4:14-16 and 10:19-22 . Have you ever felt like you could <i>not</i> come into God's presence? Why did you think that way? How will you grab hold of the opportunity you have to come boldly into the presence of God through the cross of Jesus?
8.	The cross also gives us power over sin. Read Romans 6:1-14 . What does it mean to be "dead to sin" and "alive to God" in Christ?
	There are three key terms in this passage: Know (v.6, 8), count (v.11), and offer (v.13). Are there sins that dominate your life? How will these verses help you experience freedom from the sins that rule your life?
9.	Based on Pastor Brad's sermon and your study, what is one way the Lord is inviting you to respond to the pain and power of the cross of Christ?
