4. Read **Acts 2:42-47** and **Galatians 6:2**. Church is not a place you go to, but a family you participate in. How did the early believers *participate* in church?

What was essential for them to participate?

What opportunities are available to you here at ACC for this kind of sharing together?

5. Read **Ephesians 4:16** and **1 Corinthians 12:27**. God did not bring you to ACC to sit and soak in a spiritual spa, but to serve. How does God want you to serve at ACC, in your neighborhood, and at your workplace?

6. Read **1 John 3:10** and **John 13:35**. Explain in your own words what **1 John 3:10** means in practical everyday activities.

Why does Jesus say in **John 13:35** that it is important to prove to unbelievers that you are a Christian?

7. Consider these levels of being part of the family of God:
- Choosing to belong – Have I trusted Christ? Have I been baptized? Am I a member of ACC?
  - Choosing to share in – Do I participate in worship? Am I in a Life Group? Do I share life with others?
  - Choosing to do my part – Where is your niche for serving? What is your responsibility here? What's your contribution?
  - Choosing to love other believers like a family – Are there others here at church who know you'll be there for them in their crisis?

Where would you put yourself in these levels of involvement? What must you do to go to the next level?
