- 4. Paul lists several qualities of elders in vv.**5-9** that demonstrate blameless leadership. How does an elder demonstrate blameless character
 - a) in his family
 - b) in God's household
 - c) with God's word?

How do these qualifications differ from the qualifications for leadership in business, government, or other areas of our culture?

Why are these qualities so crucial for church leadership?

5. If you don't hold a position of leadership at ACC, do you think these qualities have any application to your life? If so what?

Considering each of the character traits listed, what would our church look like if our leaders did not have those qualities?

6. Church leadership is a heavy responsibility. How can Titus **1:5-9** help you pray for the elders of ACC?
