Our series in Esther is called "Where is God?" because God is never mentioned in the book, which invites you to become someone who looks for where He is at work, even when it isn't obvious.

Use these questions to discuss the sermon from Sunday, focusing on how you can **grow** as an everyday follower of Jesus and how you can **go** accomplish what Jesus calls you to do.

1.	Where do you see God at work in Chapter 3 of Esther?
2.	Have someone read Esther 3:13 . Imagine being a Jewish family living in Susa at this time. How would this development affect you and your relationship with God?
3.	Have someone read 1 Peter 5:6-11 . What does this passage teach us about how God is at work in this midst of suffering and trials?

4.	Have someone read Galatians 6:2 . How can you go and serve people that Jesus has put in your life who are in this midst of difficult seasons?

5. What aspects of your life make it difficult to see God right now? How can you **grow** as a follower of Jesus in having faith that God is good even when you can't see it?
