Sermon questions

We are in a new series celebrating ACC's 100th birthday this month! We will take three weeks to look at God's faithfulness to our church over the past century, God's mission for us today, and where God is taking us in the future.

Use these questions to discuss the message from Sunday, focusing on how you can **grow** as an everyday follower of Jesus and how you can **go** accomplish what Jesus calls you to do.

1. Pastor Brad encouraged us this week to consciously remember God's faithfulness in our lives. What are some specific ways that God has been faithful to you and your family?

2. Have someone read **2 Thessalonians 3:1-5**. In what ways has God protected the ACC family over the last 100 years, and how should we be praying for God's protection today?

3. In verse 4, Paul says that he is confident the Thessalonians are doing what he commanded. What kingdom work has God given ACC to do right now and how can you **go** and be a part of it?

4. Read verse 5 again. How has God used ACC to help **grow** your love of God and trust in Jesus? In what ways do you need to continue to grow right now?

5. Have someone read **Ephesians 1:15-16**. Paul is constantly expressing his gratitude for the churches that he interacts with. What do you have to be grateful for as part of the ACC family? Close by praying for ACC and offering thanks for how God has blessed you through our church.
