Big Idea: The Gospel is Good News and God is just in judging those who reject it.

The problem: Israel, God's chosen nation, has largely rejected Jesus.
The Question: "Then isn't God unfaithful?"
Answer #1: No, because the promise was always for those who respond in
Psalm 115:3 "Our God is in heaven; He does whatever pleases Him."
God's Sovereignty: God does whatever God wants to do.
Malachi 1:2-3
Answer #2: No, because God has been and
with people who are to Him.
Discussion Question: Where is God showing you patience and mercy right now and how is He calling you to repent?

Sermon questions

We're in a series in the book of Romans called Good News where we are studying the many ways that the gospel is good news for everyone. This week, our passage is **Romans 9:1-29**, and we learn that the gospel is good news and God is just in judging those who reject it.

Use these questions to discuss the message from Sunday, focusing on how you can **grow** as an everyday follower of Jesus and how you can **go** accomplish what Jesus calls you to do.

1. After reading the passage and listening to the message, what is clear and what is unclear to you about what this passage means?

Read Romans 9:13 and Malachi 1:1-3. What is Paul's point in the story of Jacob and Esau?

3.	Read Jeremiah 18:1-10 and then go back and reread Romans 9:19-24 . How does Jeremiah 18 help you understand Paul's point in Romans 9?
4.	What does it mean that God is sovereign? (See Psalm 115:3). How can you grow in trusting God and not trying to control what only He can control?
5.	Have someone read vs. 1-3 . Have you experienced any of the emotions Paul describes about anyone who has rejected Christ? Spend some time praying that God would use you to go and share the gospel with those who still need to respond to Jesus.
