## Sermon questions

Meet Daniel. A man who stayed radically faithful to God and thrived in his faith while living right in the middle of one of the most godless kingdoms of all time. He has a lot to teach us about what it looks like to be an exile—a citizen of God's kingdom who lives in the tension of being in the world but not of it. We are continuing our series in Daniel, and our passage this Sunday is **Daniel 4**. The Big Idea is: *Exiles proclaim the True King in humility*.

Use these questions to discuss the message from Sunday, focusing on how you can **grow** as an everyday follower of Jesus and how you can **go** accomplish what Jesus calls you to do.

1. If the very last verse of the chapter is the POINT of the chapter, read **Daniel 4** together as a group and identify ways in which God accomplishes the task of humbling the proud.
2. The chapter also offers a glimpse into several helps to give a diagnosis and prognosis for pride. Using that as a starting point, what are some ways we can diagnose pride in our lives? What are some things that tend to happen in people's lives as a result of pride?

3. Has God ever humbled you? How did it happen and how did you respond?
4. We can't become humble by simply deciding to stop being proud. In practical terms, what are some ways we can **grow** in humility?
5. Pastor Steve suggested in his message that one reason we don't **go** and proclaim Jesus to unbelievers as much as we should is because in our casual everyday conversations with other Christians we don't practice that skill. Do you agree or disagree and why?
