Message questions

We continue in our journey through *God's Story* in our second series called *Kingdom People.* Throughout this series, we'll explore stories of the kingdom of Israel and see how each story can grow our longing for King Jesus and a greater desire to submit to his rule and reign. 2. In the same chapter, what types of desires and expectations do you observe in God's people that you still see in us today?

3. Finally, in this chapter, how do you see the gospel on display?

4. Seeing Samuel's example, single out one area of your life where you possess leadership/influence and name at least one way you need to **grow** to be a more godly leader.

5. If leadership is influence, who can you **go** to/pursue/pray for this week and point that person to the selfless sacrificial love of King Jesus?
