Message questions

We continue in our journey through *God's Story* in our third series called, *Rebel Prophet.* We'll be in the book of Jonah and will discover that Jonah is given a mission and mandate by God to deliver a message, but the twist of this book is that Jonah doesn't want to be a prophet. As we look at our own hearts, do we truly desire to bring God's message to those who need to hear it?

This week our Big Idea is *God's judgment is often the beginning of God's grace if we will receive it.* Our passage this week is **Jonah 1:17-2:10**

Use these questions to discuss the message from Sunday, focusing on how you can **grow** as an everyday follower of Jesus and how you can **go** accomplish what Jesus calls you to do.

1. What themes in Jonah's prayer jumped out to you?

2. Have someone read **Jonah 2:7-9.** What do you notice about this section of Jonah's prayer, and what is missing in his response?

3. Jonah's prayer is a bit of a "sorry, not sorry" prayer. How does God respond, and what do we learn about God by his response to Jonah? Share a time when you have given the "sorry, not sorry" prayer to God.

4. God's judgment is often the beginning of God's grace if we will receive it. How have you seen judgment and grace show up in your life, and how has it caused you to **grow**?

5. God is present and moving despite our heart's location. How can we wake up and open our eyes to what God has for us and **go** to our relational worlds with this message of salvation?
