Unexpected: The Gospel of the Servant King

Mark 5:1-20

(Page 815-816, 994-995, or 1006)

Sermon Questions:

1. Is there really evil in the world? Do you think Satan is a real being? If so, how does he do his work today?
2. Read **Mark 5:1-8**. How bad off was this man?

If you had been a disciple that day and had just come through a storm (**Mark 4:35-41**), how would you have responded to this situation?

3. Pastor Brad talked about Jesus' power to deliver from demonic possession. Read vv.**6-15**. How does Jesus demonstrate His power in this man's life?

4. Read **Mark 5:5**. What do you think this man's body looked like?

Do you have "scars" in your life? Can Jesus use people with scars? Has Jesus healed or used "scars" in your life?

5. What do you think was the man's attitude and outlook as he went home to tell his friends and family about what Jesus had done for him?

What's your attitude when you talk about Jesus? Do you tell people what He has done in your life? What do you say?

6. Where do you think the disciples were when all this was going on? How do you think they reacted? Do you think they asked something similar to the question in **Mark 4:41**?

7. This passage teaches that Jesus has the power to save anyone, even someone who is as enslaved as this man was. Can you think of anyone who seems to you to be beyond Jesus' ability to save? Why do you think that? When will you start believing Jesus can save them, and pray for that person?

Next week: Read **Mark 5:21-43**. Ask yourself, "What do I learn about Jesus? About people?" and "How should I respond?"
